Notes From The Political Field

W. C. Moore of Flora has been serving as deputy sheriff since Nov. 30, 1903, when he received his first appointment from Sheriff J. C. Shackelford. Notwithstanding Mr. Moore is a straight-out Republican, he has been continued as deputy by Sheriff J. M. Blakely, who reappointed him in September, 1904, and again in August, 1906. This is certainly an evidence of confidence in his abilities, that he has performed his duties satisfactorily, and is also the best recommendation for the office of sheriff itself. His home paper says Mr. Moore is well capable of filling that office, and "has already proven himself to be a fearless protector of justice." He is a candidate for the Republican nomination at the primary on April 17. Mr. Moore has been a resident of the North Country for 19 years and still resides on his original homestead near Flora.

"Pace is the best assessor we have ever had in Wallowa county," is a remark you can hear anywhere in the county when the subject of assessing is talked. He has unearthed more property and thus lessened the burdens on the "little fellows." Unlike assessors in many counties who sit in their offices and let deputies do the real work, "Sam" goes out and sees the property. He has probably been in more places in Wallowa county more times than anyone else. He is one of the first, if not the first assessor to follow the letter and spirit of the law in assessing at full valuation. Mr. Pace can stand on his record without fear of results.

Arthur H. Rudd, candidate for the Republican nomination for county surveyor, was out attending to some work on Swamp Creek last week. Assessor, for whom he worked, expressed himself as well pleased with the speed and accuracy of the work and the resulting reasonable charges.

Attorney D. W. Sheahan, Wallowa county's candidate for circuit judge, returned Sunday from Union county. Mr. Sheahan is going to receive strong support in Union county at the primary, and of course will run well here at home.

T. T. Geer is the only aspirant for congress from the Second congressional district who so far has thought well enough of Wallowa county voters to announce his candidacy in a Wallowa county paper. Geer's card is in the Joseph Herald.

Turner Oliver, a LaGrande lawyer, well and favorably known in Wallowa county, is a candidate for the Democratic nomination for joint senator from this district.

Two new announcements in the candidate columns this week—W. C. Moore of Flora, Republican, for sheriff, and J. T. McLain of Joseph, Democrat, for county judge.

Ed Rumble of Elgin is a probable candidate for joint senator from Union and Wallowa counties on the Republican ticket.

Frank V. Bowman of Joseph, candidate for Republican nomination for sheriff, was in Enterprise, Monday.

Cake Stands For Popular Rights

H. M. Cake, Republican candidate for the United States senatorship, has issued a clear cut, concise, fearless and practical platform that will make thousands of votes for Mr. Cake and should nominate him for the senate.

He declares his intention to stand by the progressive laws which have been enacted by the people of Oregon; he defies corrupt ring rule, stands flatly upon his own merit and the merit of his platform and will make a clean, fearless, open fight for this high office. His declaration on Statement No. 1 is worth of being repeated in every paper in the state. It contains food for thought which will convince many doubting Republicans of the absolute fairness and justice and broad republicanism of this principle.

Mr. Cake says of the statement: "I endorse statement No. 1 because experience has shown the old method of election of United States senators to be unsatisfactory. Under such method, for more than 40 years, such influences have affected the election of United States senators in Oregon that but few have been chosen until the last moments of the legislative sessions.

"The deals and deadlocks (saying nothing of corruptions) incident to the election of senators in Oregon have absorbed the time and attention of state legislatures to the disgrace of the state, the detriment of the people and the neglect of needed legislation.

"I further endorse statement No. 1 for the reason that I am in favor of the election of United States senators by direct vote of the people, and favor an amendment to the constitution of the United States providing for same. In the absence of such an amendment, statement No. 1 accomplishes the same result by obligating the members of the legislature to elect the choice of the people, as evidenced by the vote at the June election.

Chamberlain's Out For U. S. Senator

Salem, March 21—George E. Chamberlain, governor of Oregon, is a candidate for the United States senate, to succeed Charles W. Fulton. Yesterday afternoon the governor made the announcement of his candidacy, pledging himself should he be elected, to serve the people of the state irrespective of party, fairly, earnestly and impartially, and promising should the office fall to him, to place country above party and to support those measures whether of a Republican or Democratic administration, which his conscience approved as best calculated to promote the best interests of the country at large and the state of Oregon.

In making his announcement, Governor Chamberlain states that he has been requested by friends of different political belief to become a candidate for the office. He has received the endorsement of his own party in different counties of the state.

In outlining his position the governor places himself straight as a firm believer in and supporter of the direct primary law and in the right of the people of the state to nominate candidates for all offices. He reiterates his belief in the principle that the people should elect by direct vote the United States senators, and takes the stand that no member should be elected to the legislature who does not sign statement No. 1 without qualification.

The principle of the direct election of the senators in the state is the only issue of the present campaign, the governor contends, and it is one which involves the maintenance of the primary law in its integrity and the right of the people to rule. It is a death-struggle between the people on the one hand and a corrupt system on the other.
