Notes From The Political Field

Flora Journal: We still advocate W. G. Locke for county commissioner and claim it as our right to have one member of the county court chosen from our midst.

The total registration for the primary in Union county is 3117.

Total registration for the primary in Wallowa county is 1741, nine delayed ballots from Park, six Republicans and three Democrats, three from Promise and scattering ones from other precincts accounting for the increase of 16 over the totals in the table published in last week's News Record.

On the Republican county ticket for only one office is there but one candidate—county judge. There are five candidates for the Republican nomination for sheriff, two for treasurer, four for assessor, two for school superintendent, two for surveyor and two for county commissioner, but no candidates for county clerk or coroner. There are 18 names for county offices on the Republican ballot.

No names appear on the Democratic primary ballots for three county offices—school superintendent, surveyor and coroner. For one office, county clerk, there is but one candidate, W. C. Boatman, and he is further honored by having no opponent on the Republican ballots. This would be equivalent under the old convention system to being nominated by both parties, an exceptional honor, and is due both to personal popularity and his fitness for the office. Two Democrats seek the nomination by their party for county judge, two for sheriff, two for treasurer, three for assessor and two for county commissioner, making a total of 12 names for county offices on the Democratic ballots.

Cake is considered pretty good most any day in the year by a big majority of people, but indications are it is going to be extra popular Friday of this week.

The next judge of the 10th judicial district will be a resident of Wallowa county if the Democratic voters of this county do their duty Friday.

It will keep the Hon. D. W. Sheahan busier to live up to his picture in last week's News Record, than to fulfill all the good things that were said about him in that same paper. It's lucky for his opponents the women can't vote.

Gene W. Hall, the candidate for school superintendent, informs us that, if he is nominated and elected by the voters of Wallowa county, he will devote his entire time to the duties of the office. He also states that he will not engage in teaching during his term except for the purpose of filling vacancies, and in the latter case his services will be given without expense to the district.

The standing in his home community of V. T. Bell, candidate for the Republican nomination for treasurer, is evidenced by the favor with which the mention of his name for mayor is received. Mr. Bell came within an ace of being elected treasurer two years ago, and his friends are confident that this time he will have votes to spare. He is a square man in his personal business, and will see that the county is given a square deal if he is elected treasurer of the people's money.

The first candidate to be brought out by the North Country this spring was C. H. Allen for the Republican nomination for assessor. No man ever received a more flattering endorsement from his community than he did. Mr. Allen has proven a good mixer and is making a lot of friends on his present trip to the valley.

All guesses of the successful ones at Friday's primary include "Uncle Hi" Williams—a Democratic nominee for county judge. The voters know just exactly where he stands on every question likely to come before the court. There are no strings (or Williams). If he is elected, he will be judge. While he may not be acceptable to the silk-stocking brigade, or those who favor big appropriations, yet the 160 acre taxpayer, who believes in keeping expenses down to the lowest notch compatible with good public service, like Williams and will vote for him in sufficient numbers to more than make up for the other fellows.

"It's pleasant to see brothers dwelling together in unity," said Sol Pace as he stood watching the rival candidates for the Democratic nomination for sheriff, Edgar Marvin and E. C. Berry, in the same buggy driving out of Enterprise Monday for Joseph and Prairie Creek. Sol is long on scriptural quotations.

Climbing Into Cake Bandwagon

In spite of the desperate efforts of the old machine and representatives of certain big "trusts" to accomplish his defeat, the nomination of H. M. Cake, champion of statement No. 1, for United States senator on April 17th, is generally conceded throughout the state. It is predicted in Portland that he will carry Multnomah county by between 5000 and 6000. With few exceptions, the newspapers of the state have rallied loyally to Mr. Cake's support.
