July Term, 1908.

Wednesday, July 1. Present: O. M. Corkins, county judge; W. C. Wilson and Sam Litch, county commissioners; J. M. Blakely, sheriff; J. A. French, county clerk.

In the matter of the vote at the last general election for and against prohibition:

It appearing that on the 4th day of March, 1908, a petition of 10 per cent of the registered voters of the county was filed in manner prescribed by law, an election ordered by the county clerk, and the abstract of the vote of such election showed that for the prohibition of the sale in the entire county of Wallowa, there were 119 votes yes, and 686 votes no, being a majority in favor of prohibition of 415 votes, it is ordered and declared the result of said election was in favor of prohibition, and the same is hereby entered of record in the journal of the court.
