Another change or addition that we know will be an improvement and that will be permanent is a complete summary of the news of Oregon and the Northwest particularly, and of the wold generally. This includes a special Washington, D. C. letter, and the Forlland and Seattle market reports.

The present News Record is frequently praised for its local news service. The twice a-week paper will be even better in that respect, as more space will be available for that purpose

The biggest single improvement, however, will be in the county news service, cramped heretofore for lack of space. All the news of Joseph, Lostine, Wallowa, Flora and the North Country, the Promise Land, Imnaha and the hill country, will be gathered by a competent staff of reporters whose instructions will be to do all in their power to make their sections known to the world through the columns of the News Record.
