THE DALTONS.

In those days, too, the Indian Territory was almost exclusively a cattle country. Men from Texas, Arkansas, Missouri and Kansas held great herds there, and the country was taken up with big ranches containing thousands and thousands of acres. Herding cattle was about the only occupation, and to become a cowboy and learn to rope and tie a steer was the first impulse of the growing territorial youth. To aspire to be a good cowboy and finally foreman of a ranch was a laudable ambition. It was a free, easy, reckless life, with few restraints and every man was practically a law unto himself. It goes without saying that all apprentices did not turn out good cowboys, and the opportunities to drop into some other easy channel of existence were numerous and tempting. It has been frequently observed that the evolution of the outlaw began with the cowboy. It ran: cowboy, deputy marshal, outlaw. When a cowboy became desperate and reckless enough, the deputies usually caught him as a poacher, and as soon as there was an opening he became a cowboy. It is well known in the Southwest that the older boys of the Daltons were respectable, well-to-do men, while the younger set indulged the outlaw—George Elmer McCallister in The Pacific Monthly for September.
