**Household Hints.**  
The quickest cleaner for a sticky bread or cake pan is a crust of stale bread.  
A dish of water kept on the radiator will improve the air of a steam heated room.  
A scratch on polished furniture can be almost obliterated by rubbing vigorously with linseed oil.  
Fringed dollies are kept in better condition if the fringe is brushed with a small nail brush rather than with a comb.  
The darkest stain on mirror or window pane can generally be routed with a flannel dipped in spirits of camphor. Rub until dry.  
A good silence cloth for the dining table can be made with a double thickness of white flannel laid with the soft side on the inside and quilted on the machine. Edge with a binding of white tape.

**Facts From France.**  
France has more than 217 miles of pneumatic tubes for conveying the mail, divided between Paris, Lyons and Marseilles.  
There are 85,840 trees in Paris, and each tree has its number, age, history and condition recorded in the books at the Hotel de Ville. The appropriation for this department is 450,000 francs a year.  
Two French army dogs have drawn light ambulances, the invention of a lieutenant, with a load of 100 pounds each, for some 375 miles without a breakdown, showing how they can be used in war.

**An Artist's Mustache.**  
The mustache was not viewed with favor in England in the middle of the last century. An anecdote is told of the late Thomas Cooper, the English artist, to illustrate. He was brought before a magistrate in 1846 on some minor charge and was described in the police report as being "fashionably dressed, with large mustaches." Carabietta and Pentillino, near Lugano, head the list with 327 and 331 sunny days respectively in one year. Possibly because of this liberal amount of sunshine the percentage of old people is exceptionally high in the canton of Tessin, forty-four per thousand being over seventy years old and ten per thousand over eighty.—New York Post.
