TWO WAYS CONTRASTED.

In Oklahoma it seems to be a little hard on the good banks to have to put up for the bad banks, but the lesson seems to be that examiners of banks must examine banks, and that it is better for the banks to wait for their little percentage of contribution to the guarantee fund than for the depositors to pay a receiver for 20 years and draw down in dribbles and so-called dividends possibly 50 per cent of their money in all. 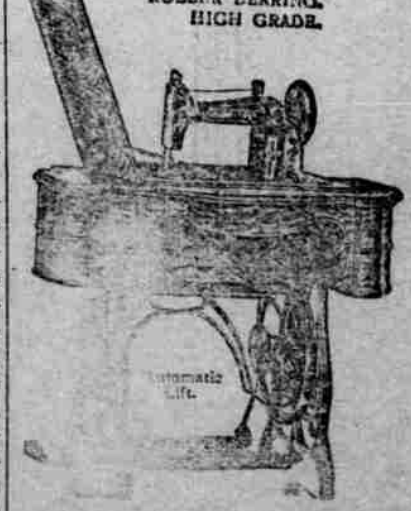
