Much Good Land Restored To Entry


Over 165 Tracts Will Be Thrown Open To Filing Next

The proclama ion restoring to entry certain lands in the Wallowa National forest will probably be issued early next month. While the amount to be thus restored is not as great as recommended by Supervisor Harris, yet a large number of sections of good agricultural land will be thrown open to settlement in this county.

Most of the restored land will be in nine townships lying north of this city, and all unappropriated land in townships 3 and 4 north, 42. In the last two named townships there will be perhaps about 65 or 70 tracts, and in the nine townships near this city over 100 tracts.

Most of the tracts have more or less timber on them, and many have excellent meadow land and springs.
