### Placing the Immigrants.

In a recent speech on the assimilation of immigrants Secretary Nagel of the department of commerce and labor outlined a policy which looks to more vigorous state action in this particular field. Nearly all of the states are vitally interested in this matter of placing immigrants right as soon as they land States contiguous to the great ports of entry are in a position to do good missionary work for the nation at large while they look after their own particular interests.

In front of Columbia university library are two English yews which were brought from England in 1809 and set out in St. John's park. Later they were removed to the Elgin botanical gardens at Fiftieth street, which were then a part of Columbia. In 1897 the trees were transplanted to Morrisville heights. On the upper part of the island near Spuyten Duyvil stands the largest tulip tree on Manhattan. It has a diameter of six and a quarter feet. Near Fordham square, in the Bronx, is the Steinton willow, said to be 300 years old, and at the foot of Cypress avenue are the two largest cypresses in the country. They stand on land once a part of the Gouverneur Morris estate.—New York Sun.
