There is no need for any suggestion from Enterprise to the Lostine people, in this temporary matter. 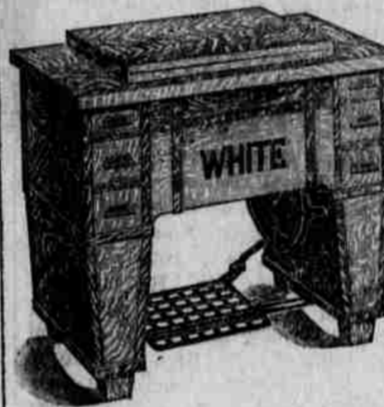
