IT WAS A FARCE.

Exception is taken by the Oregonian to calling the recent assembly a farce. That paper says it was representative of the Republican party in Oregon.

In this county no meeting of voters of any kind was held for selection of delegates. If they were selected by the county central committee or any part of it, the affair was kept mighty secret. Nothing was known of it here until a list of 18 names was published in the Oregonian as the "delegates" from Wallowa county. The fact is there were but three Wallowa county men in the assembly, and the inference is they were self-appointed.

It is doubtful if 18 men could be scared up in the whole county who are opposed to the direct primary—and nullifying the direct primary is what that assembly meant if it meant anything.

If it didn't mean that, it was a worse piece of bunc than the Jeffrey-Johnson fight at Reno.

The three "delegates" from this county are representative, leading men, and good Republicans; but no better than a thousand other Republicans; they were not delegated to act for the thousand others, nor are

COUNTY CONVENTION NOTICE.

The Socialist Party of the county of Wallowa is called to meet in County Convention at Local Enterprise Headquarters, at Enterprise, Oregon, on the 31st day of July and the 1st day of August, 1910, for the purpose of nominating a county ticket for Wallowa county, and electing delegates to the State Convention to be held in Portland on the 7th and 8th day of August, 1910.

If the county does not wish to make their county nominations on that date, the confirmation of the previously elected Delegates, in accordance with the S. P. Constitution (Art. 14; Secs. 1 and 2), must be made by placing the signature of the convention Chairman and Secretary on their credentials for presentation to the State Convention.

These credentials must also bear the signature of the Chairman and Secretary of the Local at which meeting they had been previously elected.

To explain: The Convention officers legalizes the delegates credentials to the State Convention in accordance with the Oregon statutes. The signature of the party, local, officers confirms the election of the Delegates as per S. P. Constitution.

We are advised by Attorney General Crawford that this course of procedure gives us a place on the state ticket without any filing fee. We have the privilege of using one or more pages in the candidates election advertising sheet for the purpose of setting forth our party principles.
