Official Proceedings Of County Court

Be it remembered, that at a regular term of the County Court of the State of Oregon, for the County of Wallowa, begun and held at the Court House in the City of Enterprise, in said County and State, on Wednesday the second day of November, A. D. 1910, the same being the first Wednesday in said month and the time fixed by law for holding a regular term of court, when were present: Hon. J. B. Oimsted, County Judge; Sam Litch, and W. G. Locke, County Commissioners; W. C. Boatman, Clerk; Edgar Marvin, Sheriff.

The following proceedings were had, to-wit:

In the matter of the proposed road petitioned for by Wm. J. Sainjar, and others:

Now, at this time William J. Sainjar and others petition this Court, praying for the location of a County Road, comes regularly on to be heard and is appearing to the Court that said proposed road is in Wallowa County, State of Oregon, and that said petition is signed by twelve and more freeholders of said county and state, residing in the vicinity of said proposed road and that the petition correctly describes the beginning, intermediate points and terminus thereof; and it further appearing to the Court by affidavit signed therein that due and legal notice of presentation of said petition to this Court, notifying all persons that application would be made by advertisement posted at the place of holding this Court and three other public places in the vicinity of said proposed road and it further appearing that a bond conditioned according to law has been filed herein, which bond is hereby approved;

It is therefore hereby considered and ordered that the prayers of said petitioners be granted, and the road viewers are hereby ordered to view and lay out said road according to law on the day of ———— 1910, and of their proceedings make due and legal return to this Court at their next regular meeting.

In the matter of appropriating money for road district No. 6:

Now, at this time the Court considers the matter of appropriating money for road district No. 6, and after fully considering the same, it is hereby considered and ordered that \$100.00 be appropriated for said road district No. 6 and the Clerk is hereby ordered to draw a warrant in favor of R. L. Scott, Road Supervisor of said district. In the Matter of the Petition of W. T. Knapp and others for the location of a County Road.

Now, on this day this matter came on to be heard upon the application of the petitioners for said road for an order declaring the same a public highway and opening it for public travel; and it appearing to the Court that the viewers report is favorable to the opening of said road and the same has been read in open court upon two separate days, and the remonstrance filed is not sufficient to deprive the Court of its jurisdiction in this matter; that the records and files of the proposed road have been submitted to the District Attorney for his opinion as required by law, and that he has made and filed his written opinion that the petition and proceedings are regular and in due form of law; and it further appearing that the appeal from the assessment of damages has been fully settled and decided in the favor of the respondent, and that the petitioners have paid to the Clerk of the Court as by the order of this Court heretofore made all damages which have been assessed in favor of the parties entitled thereto, and the Court being satisfied that said road will be of public utility, said report of the viewers is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed;

It is hereby ordered that the report of the viewers be recorded in the journal of the Court, and that the survey, profile and plan be recorded in the records of the public highways of the county, and that henceforth said road be and the same is declared to be a public highway, and that G. H. Lathrop, Road Supervisor of Road District No. 22, the district in which said road is located be and he is hereby ordered to forthwith put said road in condition for public travel, and that he open and keep said road open and in condition for public travel.

In the Matter of allowing Miscellaneous Bills against the County.

Now at this time the matter of allowing the Miscellaneous Bills against the county came on for consideration and the said bills having been submitted to the Court and the Court having passed upon and audited each of said bills separately a- appears from the sig-

nature of the Court thereon, it is therefore considered and ordered by the Court that the said bills be allowed in classes and amounts as follows:
