Oregon harvested 17,000,000 bushels of wheat this season, 11,000,000 bushels of oats, 6,000,000 bushels of potatoes, 2,000,000 pounds of wool, and 100,000 bales of hops,

Oregon orchards yielded prunes this year estimated at 15,000,000 lbs. Quantity and Quality are superior to the 1909 crop. Prunes will bring the state about \$1,250,000 this season,

The British tramp steamship, Knight of the Garter, recently cleared from Portland with the biggest cargo of lumber ever floated at this or any other port. She carries 5,300,000 feet of fir lumber, weighing approximately 8,745 net tons and valued at \$60,000. It is stated that to produce this one cargo of finished umber it would require 160 acres of the best standing timber in the Pacific Northwest. The destination is North China, where a part of the eargo, consisting of very large square timbers will be resawed by hand.
