DAUGHTER BREAKS THRU ICE -WATCH GROUSE STOCK.

Grouse, Dec. 15-A telephone from Cloverland received this morning ays while Elias Sargent's two oldest children were returning from school vesterday evening, they stopped by he way and were playing on the ice on a small pond by the roadside. The ice broke and Abble, the girl, was drowned. Her body was not found until 9 a clock last night. She was about 11 years old. The boy was found in time to save him alive but badly strangled and chilled.


