SHEARING SEASON OPENED AT LITCH'S

MAKIN PLANT STARTS TODAY AND BEAUDOIN NEXT WEEK -HEAVY CLIP.

The shearing season for Wallowa county opened Tuesday at the Litch plant, 10 miles northeast of Enterprise.

The Makin plants starts today, Thursday, and the Beaudoin plant some time next week.

It is claimed the fleeces will average higher in weight this season than for many years, as high as 10 pounds being estimated even for the big bands.

The extra weight will help some on the lower price, although the price too is looking up, and dispatches from Boston are encouraging.

At the Pilot Rock sale, Friday, every clip of fered was sold, amounting to 600,000 pounds, at from 12 3/8 to 14 5/8 cents. The prices were from two to three cents lower than last year.
