The American Bible Society has selected April 26 as the date for celebrating the translation of the Bible into English.

Secretary of State Frank W. Benson died at Redlands, Calif., April 14th. Ben. W. Olcott has been appointed to the office of secretary of State by Governor West.

The Willamette River is to be made navigable to Corvallis, eventually, if present government plans prevail. A waterway to Portland will help to develop the numerous river towns.

50,000 pounds of mohair was sold at auction in Dallas, last Saturday, at 35 1-2 cents a pound. This county produces about 150,000 of the 300,000 pounds of mohair annually grown in Oregon.

Two months ago the town of North Plains, in the Tuallin valley, consisted of a house, a tent, the United Railway station; it now has 40 houses, 150 inhabitants, a weekly newspaper, the Sentinel, and a commercial club.

Political parties are being broken up in the mad rush for office on the part of irresponsible politicians who could get nothing under party rule, but who float into positions of public trust carrying the banner, "more power to the people."

The board of superintendents of the State institutions have decided to interchange the articles they manufacture—where clothing is made, it will be made for all, and other articles in the same manner. This is an economy that will result in a benefit to all concerned.

The case of alleged bribery in the election of "Blonde Boss" Lorimer, of Chicago, to the U. S. Senate, was not settled for good when he was voted a good character by the other senators. Now his boastful friends claim that they raised a 'slush fund' of \$100,000 to secure his election. Providence will need to get busy and save him a second time.

The Christian churches were at first independent organizations; then they united to secure uniformity in teachings; then they were divided into two groups, then three, and further division and subdivision has been going on during the past four hundred years. A few men now advocate the union of these separated forces; they believe the divisions have reached the limit. Others will join them in the course of time, and the work of uniting the churches may go on for a few hundred years.

The very moment an incorporated town decides to do something to improve conditions, the grafters and grabbers get busy and want to do the work and take all the privileges and the profits. The town of Gladstone, near Portland, needs a water supply, and now comes an outsider who modestly asks a 50-year franchise, offering the town an option to buy the completed plant at \$23,480. The troubles of Hood River ought to furnish a valuable lesson to other Oregon towns in the matter of water works franchises.
