Dayton Street Bridge Condemned

On Wednesday the attention of the Mayor was called to the condition of Dayton street bridge spanning the Luckiamute. The Mayor and Street Commissioner Albert Teal examined the bridge and found that the needle-beams were in a badly rotten condition and the city marshal was ordered to close it up. The beams and supports are so badly rotted as to allow the bridge to sag rendering it unsafe.

The bridge was constructed in 1907 and without paint of any protection from the weather has been short lived. A thorough examination will be made in order to ascertain if it will be profitable to repair and cover or re-build. This is an expense not figured on and as the city is in road district No. 21 the money formerly received that could have been applied in such cases will now be distributed over the entire district and Falls City will have to repair her own bridges from a special levy.

Considerable interest is being manifested in the city election. The Mayorality is the chief attraction; four having signified their willingness to be offered up as living sacrifices upon that altar. The office of Auditor and Police Judge and City Marshal also have champions who are willing to dedicate a portion of their time to drawing the munificent salary and incidentally performing the duties incumbent. The office of councilman-at-large has only one aspirant, but there are five out for councilmen and only three places. So far as we know the candidates are all good citizens and the city would not be likely to go to the bow wows whoever may be elected.

MAYOR'S PROCLAMATION

To the Citizens of Falls City: Whereas, a wise custom has been established which calls for a general clean-up day each year in this city; and

Whereas, the time has arrived when we should look to the beautifying of our city by ridding our streets and private enclosures of the trash and rubbish that gathers there in the course of a year's time; and

Whereas, the city council of Falls City has made provisions for the hauling away of all rubbish collected on the day herein-after provided for at the expense of the city;

Now, Therefore,

I, Frank K. Hubbard, as Mayor of Falls City, by virtue of the power in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 12th day of April, 1915, shall be and the same hereby is named as a general clean-up day in Falls City, and I request that all citizens unite upon that day to make the event mean to this city all that it is intended to mean; I particularly request that the women of this city lend their efforts to see that the intention of this proclamation is fully and completely carried out. Trash and rubbish collected on that day, if placed in a box in the street (next to the curb), will be hauled away by teams in the employ of the city without any charge to the property owner. Any person having such trash and rubbish to be hauled away will notify the City Marshal.
