"The Wilson Note"

would readily turn a man loose without an embarrassing investigation. In lieu of the "unwritten law" the old and ever ready subterfuge, insanity, is now used. Lee Dale, who is charged with shooting to death, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ogilvey of Pilot Rock, June 3, so it is reported, will enter a plea of temporary insanity.

The fact that a man committed a crime while in a fit of temporary insanity is only the more reason that he should be confined, that he might not be able to vent his wrath upon innocent people. Usually their insanity lasts only until they are safe from the clutches of the law. Not long ago a young man who made a precarious living by his wits, was arrested for defrauding a man out of a considerable sum of money. By skillful maneuvers he was adjudged insane and placed in the asylum. Under the "skillful" treatment of the physician in charge, he made a remarkable recovery, being restored perfectly in a few weeks from "hopeless insanity" to a normal condition.

Another case, was an ex-District Court Clerk with predilections for cards, whiskey, etc., became insane and was sent to the asylum. His accounts were audited and it was found that he was short nearly \$2000. He, too, made a remarkable recovery.

When a man commits a crime while temporarily insane put him where he can not do harm and keep him there long enough to prevent any desire to repeat the act and also discourage anyone else who may have an incipient desire to go "bug-house."
