## Schooi Money to Loan

Dallas, Ore., July 13, 1915. Walter L. Tooze, Jr.. Attorney or the State Land Board in Polk County, received information this morning that he could accept applications for loans from the School Fund. There is only a imited amount of money available at this time. The Board loans not to exceed $\$ 2500$ to any one person, and will not loan to exceed $3-4$ of the Assessed value of the security offered as shown by the last Assessment roll in the County Court House. No loans will be made except upon farm security. The note bears interest at $6 \%$, and is due in one year, with the privilege of letting t run'ten years by keeping the interest paid promptly. After the first year the borrower can pay off the principal in any way he wishes, the Board accepting at any interest-paying period any payment upon the principal which the borrower might want to make. The applicant must furnish an abstract of title showing
