Grandfather Takes Child

The last act in the tragic death of Mrs. Alice Palmer who died suddenly at Black Rock, June 19 was enacted and the curtain drawn, in so far as Polk county is concerned when A. S. Wertheim, father of the woman left for Texas with her two year-old son, Rex Palmer. Mr. Wertheim only recently learned of the fate of his daughter and came at once and gained permission of the county court to take the child to his home in Texas.

Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Trimbel of this city have been caring for the child since his mother's death and were in hopes of being allowed to adopt him, but it was not to be. They had become attached to the child and are much grieved.
