The Magazines Will Stop Promptly, When Time is Up

Says He Found Way to Grow Plants on Chemical Diet.

Cleveland, O .- J. A. Smith, manager of a drug store here, claims to have growing in his greenhouse healthy sweet corn planted in absorbent cotton which has been treated only with the

Mr. Smith has worked on his discovrequires and in just what proportions to feed it nitrogen, potash and the to have a diet formula for almost every known plant and vegetable.

Having made an analysis of the soil he introduces the chemicals in which that soil is weak for the production of a given plant. Any kind of soil will do. Even cinders will suffice. The only use for the soil in Mr. Smith's process is to support the plant stalk just as a trellis supports the grapes or sweet peas.

This is why, Mr. Smith contends, it is possible to grow plants in absorbent cotton. He merely saturates the cot ton with a solution of the natural food for the plant it is intended to grow.
