Mr. Bryan, while denouncing Wilson for having gone "joy riding with the jingoes", insists that he has no personal differences with his former chief. We believe that sacred history tells of one who approached his victim asking, "Art thou in health, my brother?"

The recent disgraceful scenes in the (Democratic) legislature of Oklahoma are the logical result of President Wilson's pardon of two (Democratic) politicians who were convicted for enforcing the "grandfather clause" which the Supreme Court has declared invalid. When a man who is sworn, as the President is, to maintain the Constitution, will pardon, for partisan reasons, men who have violated the Constitution, he passes the word to all the thugs to get busy.

"There is at least an even chance that Oklahoma will swing into the Republican column in the elections this fall, that we will gain two Republican Congressmen from that state, and that many gains will be made by the party in state officers", said a Middle West Republican Congressman to a group of colleagues. "For some time Oklahoma has been heading towards Republicanism. The development of the state has brought in many new residents from the eastern states who are of our party faith. The Democrats, realizing they were slipping, have been endeavoring to disfranchise the negro in that state, hoping to save their bacon, but they have made such a mess of it, which ended with the disgraceful row in the legislature a few days since, that public opinion in the state has been stirred by such tactics. It has hurt the Democrats and driven many voters to the ranks of the Republicans, and when November comes do not be surprised if Oklahoma looms up in the list of Republican states. Certainly the indications point that way, and at least two of the present Democratic Congressmen are greatly alarmed over the outlook in their districts."

SILETZ RESERVATION TO OPEN

The Siletz Indian Reservation which is about forty or fifty miles west of here will be thrown open the first of the month for home-steading. There are 16,000 acres of land, which will make 100 claims to be filed on. The land in this section of the country is said to be some of the best in the state.

House Goes Up In Smoke

House at Black Rock Destroyed by Fire. Believed to Have Been Incendiary.

A house belonging to Chris Soderstrom of Black Rock was destroyed by fire early Monday morning under very suspicious circumstances. Just before Christmas, Soderstrom left for a visit. During his absence a woman named Grace C. Taylor moved in without consulting anyone and upon Soderstrom's return he was unable to dislodge her. He made several attempts to induce her to vacate and finally consulted a lawyer who advised him to serve her with a written notice giving her ten days to vacate and if she failed to do so to go to Justice of the Peace Hubbard and secure a writ of ejection and the constable would then set her effects into the street. He served the notice on her last Saturday and on Sunday she moved into another house. It is said that in the afternoon she went back to the house she had just vacated and tore the paper from the walls and cut the tarred roof on the shed room as far as she could reach. Early Monday morning the building was discovered on fire.

The woman has a daughter about fifteen years old and steps are being taken to have the girl taken to the Boys and Girls Home at Portland.

TIE INSPECTION
