The people of the United States are wont to boast that the "People Rule," that the president and congress are servants; yet it is pitiful how little the people know of diplomatic affairs. "State Secrets" possibly hide many an intrigue and conditions that if known would bring about a revolution. Some things have leaked out with regard to the brilliant campaign against Spain, that happily resulted in the freedom of Cuba, but leaves it a question if there was really so much glory after all. That the matter could have been amicably settled, is asserted, but that war served some of the big interests better than a peaceful solution, and that in order to exploit Cuba it was necessary that the United States should hold the reins and that could be done only through intervention of arms, just as is being tried to be brought about with regard to Mexico. Standard Oil properties would be more valuable with Uncle Sam's armies camped near than Villa in the brush or even Carranza. The president, himself believes that schemes are being worked in the United States to bring about intervention. He should go after such parties with the same relentless vigor he is pursuing the submarine question. You can arouse very little "patriotism" by the destruction of Standard Oil properties, but the killing of American men and women along the border and the raids across, such as the Columbus raid brings out the desired patriotism and there was no lacking for men to cross the border in pursuit of the bandits.

The term mollycoddle is being used in bad taste and it will act as a boomerang on he who uses it.

It is not the noisy man that makes the soldier in times of need no more than it is the barking dog that puts up the fight. The American people are not likely to get particularly excited because some of the F. F. V's., come to grief, but when the reveille is sounded their patriotism will not be questioned.

POSTAL SAVINGS DEPOSITS

Larger postal savings deposits will now be accepted at the Post Office. This is made possible by an important amendment to the Postal Savings Act just approved by President Wilson.

A postal savings depositor may now have an account amounting to \$1,000 upon which interest will be paid. Formerly \$500 was the maximum amount they could have to their credit. This enlargement of postal savings facilities will be very gratifying to thousands of depositors who have already reached the \$500 limit and are anxious to entrust more of their savings to United States. Another feature of the amendment that will avoid further embarrassment to the public and to postal officials is the doing away with the limit on the amount that could be accepted from a depositor monthly.

Under the old law only \$100 could be deposited in actual calendar months. The amendment abolished this restriction.

While the Postal Savings System has already proven a signal success as is shown by the fact that more than half-million depositors have over eighty million dollars standing to their credit, still it has fallen short of meeting the full demands of the public

because of the restrictions which have now been eliminated.

Postmaster General Burleson and Third Assistant Postmaster General Dockery have been tireless in their efforts to secure a modification of the limitations and the new liberalizing legislation is particular gratifying to them.
