KILLED BY FALL

Wednesday afternoon Walter Tice fell from a water tank on the Valley and Siletz rail road six miles from Hoskins killing him almost instantly. He was working on the tank and lost his footing, falling about 20 feet fracturing his skull.

Walter Tice was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. M. Tice of this city. He is also survived by his wife and one child. He was a member of the Woodman lodge.

Funeral services were held from the M. E. church Friday morning, at 10:30; interment in the I.O.O.F. cemetery.
