

MEAT CONTROL FIXED

Regulations Intended to Provide Fair Profit for Packer and Protection to Producer and Consumer.

Washington, D. C.-Appointment of J. P. Cotton, of New York, as head of the meat divison, which, after November 1, will direct the license control of the nation's packing and slaughtering industries, was announced Wednesday light by the food administration. Mr. otton will make his headquarters in hicago.

Every phase of the meat industry, well as the consuming public, will represented on advisory committees w being organized.

"Regulations under the license are ing formulated," says a food adminstration statement, "on the basis of a fair profit to the packer and protecthe farmer sells his stock. It has, however, the duty of directing export purchases of beef and pork products and proposes to use this power to stabilize the price, to support remunerative prices to the farmer and, by the excision of speculation, to protect the nsumer.

Car Shortage Hampers.

North Yakima-It is estimated by growers and shippers that the fruit shipments of Yakima valley were cut short 400 cars last week by reason of the car shortage. The apple movement is just now at its height. The shipments of the week before were more than 1100 cars, but last week they fell to 821 cars, with every warehouse and packing shed in the valley bursting with the product which the growers are now rushing to get under cover before cold weather overtakes them.
