

War Recipes

Cut out the following recipes and paste them in your cook book to help you Hooverize. They have been thoroughly tested by instructors and special lecturers in the department of economics at the University of Washington.

Hooverized Recipes for Shellfish.

Cream of Clam Soup—1 c minced clams, 1 c strained clam broth, 3 c milk, 3 tb oil or chicken fat, 4 tb flour, pepper, paprika. If fresh clams are used, no salt is required. If canned clams are used, add 1/2 ts salt. Melt fat, stirring in flour, and blend thoroughly. Add milk, slowly, stirring constantly until mixture thickens. Add the clams, reheat. Serve at once.

Escalloped Clams.—1 can minced clams or 1 c chopped fresh clams, 1/2 c clam liquor, 1/2 c milk, 2 tb cooking oil or chicken fat, 2 tb flour, 1 tb minced onions, 1/2 ts celery salt, 1-3 ts salt (omit if fresh clams are used), pepper, paprika, 1/2 c bread or cracker crumbs, 1/2 c buttered crumbs. Cook the onion in the fat for two minutes. Add flour and blend. Stir in the clam liquor and milk. When sauce thickens, add the clams and seasonings. Fill ramekins with alternate layers of fish and cracker crumbs. Cover with buttered crumbs and let brown in the oven. May be covered with crust, and baked as a pie.

Deviled Crab—1 c crab meat, 2 tb Wesson oil, 3 tb flour, 2-3 c milk, 1 egg yolk, 1/2 ts salt, 1/2 ts celery salt, 2 tb tomato catsup, 1 tb grated onion, paprika, cayenne, 1/2 c buttered crumbs. Make white sauce of fat, flour and milk. Add crab meat and seasonings. When cool add slightly beaten yolk. Place mixture in ramekins or in baking shells. Cover with crumbs and brown in oven.

Escalloped Crab—1 c crab meat, 2 tb oil or chicken fat, 3 tb cornstarch, 2-3 c milk, 1/2 ts salt, pepper, 1 tb minced onion, paprika. Place alternate layers of crab meat and white sauce in baking dish. Cover with buttered crumbs and brown in oven.

Crab Salad—1 c crab meat, 1/2 c celery finely cut, 1 pimiento finely chopped, 1-3 c mayonnaise, lettuce leaves. Mix flaked crab meat and celery together, and moisten with mayonnaise. Serve on crisp lettuce leaves. The crab may be molded in small cups before turning out on plates.

Pasture Sheep in Rainier Park.
Yakima, Wash.—The woolmen in their session here pointed out to the forestry officials the fact that sections of Rainier National Park that are wholly unused and never seen by tourists will pasture 50,000 head of sheep annually. A petition was drafted requesting the secretary of the Interior to permit grazing on such portions of the park and help increase the production of wool and mutton during the war. The woolgrowers also asked congress for a \$500,000 appropriation for the destruction of predatory animals.
