Heppner, Or., July 12—This town, which last year was wiped out by a cloudburst, again suffered but in a smaller extent last night. Many buildings in the business section were either swept away or damaged.

Shanike, Or., July 12—Private messages say the cloudburst last night swept away Mitchell, 50 miles from here. Two lives are known to be lost and the list may be heavily increased.

Hood River, July 12—A terrific wind storm this morning in this section did great damage to the crops, buildings also being unroofed.
