Norhing more of the matter reached Sheriff Mc-Clallen until about four o'clock in the afternoon, when a telephone message from Millwood announced that the boddies of the couple had been found in the river.

Further inquiry brought out the information that parties from Millwood started out to trace the eloping couple and came upon their bodies as they were crossing the river three miles below Millwood. Coroner Twitchell went to Millwood today to hold an inquest. He was accompanied by Deputy Sheriff Y.L. Bogard, who, by the way, is an uncle of the dead girl.
