E. B. Burnes was at Astoria with the Rio Rey last week. He expects to be on the bay by August 1st, and will have his cannery at Rogue river ready for the Fall run of salmon.

J. H. Miller and wife are expected home from Portland today, via the Drain route. They have been absent several weeks, during which time they visited the St. Louis exposition.

A few flocks of wild ducks are already noticed on the mudflats. They are some of the home raised "crops," the ducks from the North not making their appearance until September.

The salmon and trout fry, planted in the sandhill lakes, are doing well. Parties who were down to the lakes last week say that they saw several schools of the young fish which seemed to be thriving.
