J. E. Fitzgerald Badly Hurt.

A telephone message from Coos river was received here this morning, stating that John Fitzgerald had fallen from the loft of his barn and had been seriously injured. Dr. Horsfall was summoned and in company with Mr. Fitzgerald's sisters, Mrs. Herbert Rogers, left for the Fitzgerald place at once.

They were met on the way up, however, by the steamer Alert bringing Mr. Fitzgerald to town, and the party returned with the steamer. On their arrival here the half-conscious man was placed on a stretcher and carried at once to the city hospital where an examination of his wounds was made by Dr. Horsfall. It was found that the skull was fractured behind the right ear, that the right shoulder was broken and there is a probability that he is injured internally.

As we go to press an operation is being performed by Dr. Horsfall, assisted by Drs. McCormac and Gale, to relieve the pressure on the brain.—Tuesday's Mail.

Coos Bay Chamber of Commerce.

The Coos Bay Chamber of Commerce held its annual meeting last evening, after previous adjournment for lack of a quorum. The following board of directors was elected for the ensuing year: J. S. Coke, J. H. Flanagan, I. S. Kaufman, H. Sengstacken, Marshfield; L. J. Simpson, L. F. Falkenstein, T. W. Rennie, J. R. Robertson, North Bend; C. F. McCullom, Empire City.

For the purpose of raising money for the prosecution of the work of the organization, an assessment of \$2.50 per share on the capital stock was made.

An active canvass for new members will also be made, and a committee was appointed for that purpose, consisting of I. S. Kaufman, J. O. Flanagan and E. L. C. Farrin. It is confidently expected that quite a number of new members can be obtained, both here and at North Bend.

Mr. Beals seemed to appreciate the necessity for such a station at this port, and said that he would heartily recommend it to the Department at Washington.
