## Will Have to Answer.

Tokio, July 27.—(Bulletin.)—The Russian Vladivostok squadron was today sighted 80 miles off Tokio bay going south.

This move it is believed is for the direct purpose of intercepting several steamers which are now en route from Pacific coast of America.

Dispatches received here from America state that vessels between Seattle, Portland and San Francisco are not heeding the Russian seizures and the presumption is that this information had fallen into Russian hands and is the cause of the change of cruising grounds.

London, July 28.—While excitement here is not so high as when the first seizures of British ships by Russian were announced, there is still considerable anxiety. It is currently reported today, without confirmation however, that Great Britain has issued an ultimatum to Russia. If so it will bring matters to an immediate focus. This was apparently borne out by Balfour today.

In the house of commons today Balfour expressed the hope that he would be able to make a statement tomorrow regarding the stoppage of British vessels in the Red Sea. He added with regard to the Knight Commander: "I regret to say that information reached here this morning which leaves little doubt in my mind that a regrettable incident has occurred. There is no question as to a loss of life, but I am afraid there is a question as to breach of the international law."

The statement caused profound sensation.
