In France every carrier's and every market cart, instead of injuring the highways actually improves them by passing over. Many of the tires are ten inches wide. In four-wheeled vehicles of that country the rare axle is fourteen inches longer than the front, and as a result the rear wheels run in a line about an inch outside the level rolled by the front wheel. After a few loaded wagons have passed over a road the highway looks as if a steam roller had been at work. A national law in Germany prescribes that wagons heavily loaded must have tires not less than four inches wide. In Austria the minimum for similar vehicles is six and one-half inches; in Switzerland six inches. Evidently we don't know it all in this country, and here is one of the lessons which we may profitably learn from these foreigners. The narrow tire, with the hind and front wheels exactly tracking each other, are prime factors in making roads bad and keeping them so. Let there be a universal demand for vehicles like those in France as far as the wheels are concerned.—Ex.
