In last week's Tribune we gave an account of the disappearance of Eli Bagley who had gone fishing with hook and line near his home on Elk river, about four miles from Port Orford. Since then his body was found in the river, and there is no doubt no longer that his death was purely accidental or from natural causes, and a cloud of hasty suspicions of foul play is happily removed.

Mr. Bagley was afflicted with heart trouble, and it is believed that while wading in the stream and fishing, he was struck with instant death, as no water was found in the lungs, and that his body drifted down into deeper water but a short distance where it was found in about ten feet of water. In his pocket were several small fish, and everything indicated that no foul play had caused his death. Until his body was found on the fifth day of his disappearance, excitement and foul suspicion ran riot among the people, and had not his body been found, arrests would probably have followed, and reputations placed under suspicion from which they could never have been freed.

Mr. Bagley lost his wife about six months ago and now his death leaves four small children orphaned, the eldest not over seven years.

Fortunately they have wealthy and influential relatives in Humboldt county, California, and their uncle, Joseph Bagley is already here to look after them.—Port Orford Tribune.

The new steamer built at Porter by E. Heuckendorff will be launched Saturday, providing the machinists complete their work. She has been given the name "Wenona." Her dimensions are 70 feet keel; 16 feet beam and 4 1/2 feet hold. A cabin will cover the main deck, except a small portion aft. The Wenona was built for the Calendar Navigation Company of Astoria and will ply the lower waters of the Columbia river, for which trade she is very suitably adapted. She is a neat, trim boat and has fine lines. The Wenona will be towed to Astoria, where she receives her machinery.—Sun.
