In last week's Tribune we gave an account of the disappearance of Eli Bagley who had gone fishing with hook and line near his home on Elk river, about four miles from Port Orford. Since then his body was found in the river, and there is no doubt any longer that his death was purely accidental or from natural cavses, and a cloud of hasty suspicions of foul play is happily re-

Mr. Bagley was afflicted with heart trouble, and it is believed that while wading in the stream and fishing, he was atruck with instant death, as no water was found in the lungs, and that his body drifted down in-to deeper water but a short dis-him at Bandon. and that his body drifted down intance where it was found in about ten feet of water.
