## Disastrous Wreck.

Walla Walla, Wash., Nov. 22.—The regular Washington & Columbia River freight was wrecked last night seven miles from Hunt's Junction. Seventeen cars were thrown from the track and piled 50 feet high. Two tramps were found dead in an empty car. Most of the cars were loaded with wheat; one was consigned from Dayton with 300 sheep, all of which were killed. Neither engine nor caboose left the track. The cause of the wreck is not yet known.

## "Jack the Ripper."

Topeka, Kan., Nov. 21.—Mrs. J. R. Nickum, who was brained with an ax and otherwise terribly mutilated early Sunday morning, at her boarding-house on East Fifth street, is dead. She was unconscious when discovered and remained so until the end.

The case is the most mysterious in the criminal history of Topeka. Over \$200 cash in the dresser of her room was untouched, nor were any other valuables missing. Her body was horribly mutilated, bearing the evidences of a "Jack-the-Ripper" work. There is not the slightest evidence of who did the deed, and the police have arrested no one. Mrs. Nickum has been married twice and divorced from both husbands, the whereabouts of whom are unknown.
