Wife was the Better Shot

Oakland, Feb. 12.—Edward R. Koehn and his wife, who were married only seven weeks, engaged in a pistol duel today, with the result that the husband's body is now in the morgue. The couple quarreled immediately after marriage, and Koehn ordered his wife from the house. She returned this morning and Koehn demanded her to leave. Words followed and Koehn, so the wife said, bandished a revolver and fired at her. She seized a second revolver under a mattress, and as Koehn fired again she shot at him four times. One bullet entered his neck, killing him.

Koehn was a shipping clerk employed in San Francisco, and was 32 years old. The wife is 23 years old. She was not injured. She is under arrest.




