> We give below a letter from Second Assistant Postmaster General W. S. Shallenberger in regard to our petition, asking a change in our mail services, which is self-explanatory, and which was received by O. C. Sanford, secetary of our board of trade. The letter reads as follows:

Post Office Department. Washington D. C., April 5, 1905.

Sir: In connection with the letter from this office under date of February 13, 1905, acknowledging the receipt of your letter, forwarding a copy of the petition for the extention of services on route, No. 73356, Roseburg to Myrtle Point, Oregon, so as to end at Coquille, I have to inform you that the matter has been made the subject of care-

It has been found that mail is now being delayed at Myrtle Point, and in order to privide direct services between Roseburg and Coquille an order has this day been issued extending route 13356 to end at the latter office, which is in accordance with the suggestions contained in the petition.

The question of changing the schedules for service on routes 73356 and 73100, Myrtle Point to W H S Hyde, J P justice Bandon, has been considered, but it is not deemed advisable to materially change the schedules under the existing contracts.
