FEEDING GRAIN TO DAIRY COWS ON PASTURE.

By N. H. Koon, Oregon Agricultural College. Whether cows should or should not be fed grain when grazing is yet an undecided question.

Some of the results of experimental work at different state experiment stations regarding the matter may be summarized as follows:

At the Cornell, New York, experiment station, in a season during which the pasture was very luxuriant throughout the whole summer...

The next season a similar experiment was conducted. At no time during the season was the pasture luxuriant. A herd of sixteen cows, pure bred and registered Jerseys, was divided into two lots of eight cows each.
