## Facts Concerning Coming Elections.

General election will be held on November 5.  
Primary election April 19.  
At the general election will be elected president, vice-president, one United States senator, three congressmen from Oregon, secretary of state, sheriff, assessor, clerk, treasurer, district attorney, coroner, commissioner, justice of the peace, constable and surveyor.

At the primary election parties will nominate for the above-named offices, and in addition will express their choice for president and vice-president, and will elect delegates to their national conventions.  
Registration closes April 9.  
Last day for candidates to file nominating petitions, April 4.  
Registration re-opens April 29.  
Closes for last time May 15.

## New Enemy for Trout.

A new enemy to the trout has been discovered in Southern Oregon, according to a letter just received by C. K. Cranston, chairman of the state fish and game commission, from L. Alva Lewis, district warden for the Klamath country. This enemy is a parasite described by Deputy Lewis as "a long slender worm, perhaps from four to six inches long and about the diameter of a large sewing needle," and pinkish white in color.

According to the letter, the worm attacks the trout by getting under the skin and is usually found coiled. Its presence is easily detected by the lump on the fish.  
Deputy Lewis writes that the only streams in which he has discovered fish

affected by this parasite are two tributaries of the Siletia river which empty into Harney lake, and states that only in warm weather have such fish been found. He is of the belief that the parasite originated in the shallow water of the lake or in the marsh lands adjoining, and thinks some measure should be taken to exterminate it.—Pendleton East Oregonian.

## Ordinance No. 335.

An Ordinance for the purchase of two steel cells for the City Jail.

The Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove does ordain:

Section 1. That the City Recorder be and he is hereby authorized to contract with the E. T. Barnum Iron Works of Detroit, Michigan, for two steel cells for the City Jail of Cottage Grove, Lane County, Oregon, according to Proposal therefor No. 3254, as modified in letter of Feb. 13th, 1912, from said E. T. Barnum Iron Works, which said proposal No. 3254 as modified by said letter are hereby approved and ordered placed on file in the office of the City Recorder.

Section 2. The Contract price of said two steel cells shall be \$232, less the freight thereon to Cottage Grove, and the Mayor and City Recorder are hereby authorized to draw a warrant for said amount upon receipt and erection of said cells according to plans and specifications in said Proposal and the approval of the same by the Common Council.

Section 3. Whereas the City of Cottage Grove is without safe and sanitary accommodations for prisoners, the health, peace and safety of the City demands that the same should be provided at once, an emergency is therefore declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

## Ordinance No. 334.

An Ordinance regulating the speed of automobiles and motor cycles upon the streets of Cottage Grove and fixing a penalty.

The Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove does ordain:

Section 1. That hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person to drive an automobile or motor cycle upon Main street in the City of Cottage Grove at a greater speed than ten miles per hour and it shall be unlawful to drive any such automobile or motor cycle upon any other street or avenue in said City of Cottage Grove other than Main street at a greater speed than thirteen miles per hour.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of Section one of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and before the City Recorder shall

be fined in a sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$25, and in default of payment of such fine shall be confined in the City Jail one day for each two dollars of such fine.

Section 3. The use of any such automobile in conveying a Doctor to visit a patient, to bring relief in case of accident or its use in assistance at a fire or any other case of necessity or mercy shall be considered as a mitigating circumstance and may be considered in defense in case of arrest under Section 1 of this Ordinance.

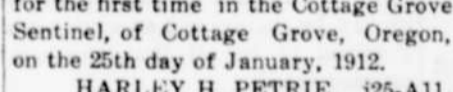
