Sane Methods Should Be Adopted and Game of Chance Eliminated Says Jour-

Mr. Parkison ought not to hastily file measure for consolidating the State university and the State Agricultural college. Nobody should rush headlong into such an endeavor. It is not a

enterprise on which to trust to luck. The launching of one measure will mean the launching of another. There might be three. The whole system of higher education in the state would be put on wheels. The whole thing would be plunged into politics, and in consequence one of the biggest storms in its

matter for haste. It is not a thing to

experiment with. It is too large an

history would burst over the state. There would be passion and bitterness. There would be an awful fight. There would be agitation and educational unrest. The whole educational interest would be plunged into the throes of a conflict from which it would not recover in ten years.

State education is not a thing for mere tinkering. Great changes ought not to be attempted with a measure based on what one man or a few men think about it. Mr. Parkison's purposes may be splendid, but his viewpoint might not be perfectly balanced. His measure might be an excellent one, but it might be very bad. There is, in any hasty movement, the element of chance, and great chance, with almost infinite opportunity for harm to state

Back of it all is the fundamental fact that the two institutions belong in . widely separated fields. They do not + belong together any more than a doctors' college and a lawyers' college. The attempt to unite them will almost | certainly eventuate into effort to kill one or the other. Its certain consequenes will be to cripple one or the other, if not both.

If we want to kill either, we ought | not to be cowardly. If we do not want | . the agricultural college, we should . vote it out of existence and leave the university alone. If we do not want the university, we should kill it without smothering the college.

In any event, if there is to be voting on the subject, let there be a wise, deliberate, painstaking, exhaustive investigation by the ablest body of men the state can muster, to the end that, if the people must vote, they may vote for the best plan that Oregon wisdom and jugment can present.

If we must tinker, let us tinker intelligently.
