GOOD ROADS BILLS EXPLAINED

Expenditure of All County Money and Part of State Fund Is Left in Hands of Judges and Commissioners.

There appears to be widespread ignorance throughout the state in regard to the provisions of the six proposed highway laws for which initiative petitions are now being circulated. Very few voters are taking the necessary time to read the bills and for that reason I have prepared a brief synopsis of the measures.

I desire to first offer a word or two of explanation in regard to the preparation of these measures. The bills were drafted by a committee of five appointed by Governor West, and this committee spent several weeks in careful deliberation. The measures provide a system by which a moderate amount of money can be raised each year through both state and county bond issues, and also provide for the distribution of funds upon a scientific and equitable basis.

State Aid Bill Explained.

The main bill, which may be called the state aid bill, creates a state road board, composed of the Governor, Secretary of State and State Treasurer, who are also empowered to act as a state bonding committee. The Governor is authorized to appoint a state highway commissioner at a salary of \$3,600 a year, and \$12,000 is set aside from the state highway fund for the payment of this salary and other expenses connected with the office.

The bill creates a state highway fund and provides for its distribution, and further, authorizes a yearly issue of bonds not to exceed \$1,000,000. It also provides for a sinking fund for the payment of principal and interest of the bonds.

The object of the bond issue in this bill is to provide funds for road construction, which may be apportioned among the counties to aid them in construction of their roads. The \$1,000,000 raised annually is to be apportioned among the various counties in the following manner: Two-thirds of this sum is to be divided into three parts; one-third is apportioned among the counties equally; one-third upon the basis of the counties' assessed valuations, the remaining one-third according to the counties' area in square miles.

Sparsely Settled Counties Law.

In order that the various counties may take advantage of this state aid fund, they are required to raise a certain amount of money, and for this purpose the counties are divided into two classes. All counties having an assessed valuation of over \$10,000,000 are of the first class. The second class is composed of all other counties in the state. Before they can secure their apportionment of the state highway fund, counties of the first class must raise by taxation or otherwise an amount equal to their apportionment from the state highway fund. In the case of counties of the second class they are required to raise an amount equal to one-half their apportionment from the state highway fund. This provision in the bill will operate to assist the poorer and more sparsely settled counties.

This bill further provides that the expenditure of this state aid money shall be wholly in the hands of the county authorities, and under the laws as they now exist for such purposes. The State Highway Commissioner is to act in respect to these expenditures only in an advisory capacity and upon the request of the county authorities.

State Roads Is Aim.

The foregoing method of distribution accounts for only two-thirds of the \$1,000,000 bond issue proposed to be raised. The remaining one-third is to be expended by the State Highway Commissioner under the direction of the state road board.

In the construction of strictly state roads, one-half the amount shall be used to construct such roads in the First Congressional District, and the remainder for similar purposes in the Second Congressional District. This provision is deemed a very wise one and was inserted in the bill for the purpose of aiding those portions of the state which are least able to help themselves in the matter of road building.

There are many stretches of road in the two Congressional Districts named which are main traveled highways, but which do not directly benefit the counties in which they lie. These roads are essential to interstate travel and their construction should therefore be effected by the state at large.

Sinking Fund Provided.

This state aid bill has been safeguarded in every manner possible and one of its principal provisions is in regard to the retirement of bonds. For this purpose a sinking fund is created, to be known as the road bond retirement fund. To supply the money for this fund taxes are to be collected in 20 annual installments, beginning in the 11th year of each issue of bonds.

It is provided that these bonds are to run 30 years and bear interest at not to exceed 4 1/2 per cent.

The sinking fund shall be invested by the state road board in the same manner in which the school fund and similar moneys are now invested by the State Land Board, or in bonds issued by virtue of this act. This provides an absolutely safe method of investment, as not a dollar of the funds so invested by the State Land Board has ever been lost.

County Bonding Bill Defined.

The second principal bill provides means for the issuance of county bonds for road construction and carefully defines the method of expending money so raised and the procedure for holding county elections and authorizes the levying of taxes for the payment of principal and interest on said bonds. The county bonds are to be 20 year serial bonds, and are to bear interest at a rate not to exceed 6 per cent. These bonds are to be issued in denominations of \$500, which provision is for the purpose of making them available to the small investor.

The County Judge, County Treasurer and County Clerk are authorized as the county bonding committee to prepare and market all county bonds. The proceeds of bond sales shall go into the general road fund of each county to be expended as now provided by law. Section 6320 of Lord's Oregon Laws provides that 50 per cent of the general road fund shall be distributed in each district in the proportion that said district's taxable property bears to the whole taxable value of the county. The remaining 50 per cent to be expended in the discretion of the County Court.

Bill Provides For Use of Convicts.

Sections 7 and 10 of article 11 of the constitution are amended in such manner that neither county nor state can issue bonds in an amount greater than 2 per cent of the assessed valuation in either case.

The two remaining petitions are for convict labor laws, which will enable the proper authorities to employ penitentiary or city and county convicts, as the case may be, upon road work or upon work in and about public buildings. This system is already practically in effect, in so far as penitentiary prisoners are concerned, but without legal authority. The bills also absolutely prohibit the making of contracts with individuals or corporations for the services of convicts. The convict labor bills are in line with the most advanced methods of prison reform and should meet with the approval of all voters. C. T. PRALL.

New Course in Milk Production.

A new course in milk production is to be offered by the dairy department of the Oregon Agricultural College next fall. Few colleges separate the manufacturing and production features of the dairy instruction, but at O. A. C. it has been decided to offer two separate courses, so that students may specialize in either branch of the industry they desire, or take both at once.

The new work will take up in detail

the care, management, breeding and feeding of dairy cattle to the end of gaining the largest possible milk production, and will also give the student a thorough knowledge of the history of pure-bred dairy cattle.

The college hopes in the near future to be able to establish in connection with this work a dairy demonstration farm of about 80 acres on which the students can gain actual practical experience of the management of a dairy business. It will be made entirely self

supporting in time, as all of the feed for the cows will be raised on this tract, where they will be bred, grazed, and cared for as on any commercial dairy farm.

The equipment of the dairy laboratories has just received the addition of another steam turbine Babcock tester, made necessary by the growth of the department since entering the new building.
