Mr. Osborn had been a resident of Eugene since 1866. He was a prominent member of the various branches of the Masonic lodge of Elks and had membership in the A. O. U. W. lodge.

## ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENTS INSTEAD OF SUPERVISORS

### Alta King Proposes Substitute for Present System.

The writer of this article was until recently passively in favor of the school supervisory law, but upon examination and study of its provisions it appears repugnant to our public school system.

Friends of the law choose to call it "The Rural Supervisory System." Such is not the law. It is a general law, applying to all counties of the state having more than 60 school districts, implying thereby that a county superintendent is competent to supervise in a county with 60 school districts or less. The law applies to every city in the state with less than 1000 school population, to all schools of the state, except the first class.

Take Lane County for an example: Every town in the county is subject to supervision under this law except Eugene. The schools of Cottage Grove employ 16 teachers, including the superintendent, high school principal and principal of the grade department. The city superintendent supervises and teaches regular work. Does Cottage Grove need supervision under this law? No, say the friends of the system, it is intended as a rural supervisory law, and that the supervisors, under the direction of the county superintendent, shall supervise only in the rural districts. Such supervision may be convenient but it is not the law. Cities pay taxes for supervision and are entitled to it, but do not get it. But it is argued, the supervisors do visit the city schools. Admitted, but it is denied they supervise. A theoretical visit once each month is not supervision. Suppose the city superintendent visited the rooms of his school and came in touch with his teachers theoretically once each month, would that be called supervision? No. It must be daily, active, sympathetic, harmonious communication: City supervision and rural supervision are essentially diverse. Under this law supervisors cannot be had who are competent and qualified to supervise from the rural schools to the city high schools.

Supervision is not defined in the law. Supervisors are not trained for definite work. They are political appointees and are not required to be professional teachers.

One superintendent raises the literary standard. He accordingly appoints an educational board and they together appoint literary supervisors. The next raises the industrial and like supervisors are appointed. Another is incompetent and unqualified but was a member of the dominant party and secured his office through politics. Perhaps his supervisors will come up to the standard raised.

There is lack of uniform supervision throughout the counties of the state, between city and city, between city and rural districts and between rural supervisory districts. The system does not tend toward uniform standardization.

It is claimed the boards of directors of rural schools do not perform their duty because they are not paid, and that the supervisor who receives a salary virtually takes the place of the school board. It is more reasonable to suppose that the county educational board appointed by the county superintendent, to serve without pay, will perform their duty? The logical conclusion is that the county superintendent practically appoints the supervisors. There is where the system begins to take root. Before the supervisory law can be effective the district school boards must be eliminated. If district school boards are not performed their duty, they will not perform them upon the recommendation of the supervisor, and friction between the supervisor, the school board and the teacher is the inevitable result.

This law is of a political nature and will bear political fruit. To eliminate district school boards, laws must be enacted granting power to employ teachers and manage the affairs of the district. Such arrangement would involve the public school system in politics, open the door to graft, place teachers and their salaries under centralized control and menace the text book law.

There is closer sympathy between the county superintendent and the district school board than between the supervisors and the school boards. The relation of county school superintendent should be retained. The supervisor is an irritating mediator, usurping authority and belittling the office of school director, and further, claims credit for duty performed and improvements made in the district school.

Repeal of the law is a return to the school system of two years ago. It's friends plead for further trial of the law. This brands the law as a theory and reminds us that there was no public demand for the law.

The superintendent and supervisors cannot train teachers and confer degrees after they are in the school room. Because Oregon has neglected the training of teachers, the supervisory law cannot take the place.

City schools employ trained teachers, even if they have to secure them from

other states, and the rural districts are entitled to a like standard of teachers. Trained teachers understand the problems of sanitation and of the school room. School journals, institute work and counsel from the superintendent keeps them in touch with the uniformity and standardization required. To such teachers supervision under this law is a reproach.

Supervisors are neither assistant superintendents nor deputies. The law is a theoretical system tacked onto the school law and neither repeals nor amends the old law. The county superintendent is now required to perform the same duties as before the enactment of this law, and any shifting of duty or responsibility onto the supervisor is a neglect of duty.

If the school standard of the state is below what it should be, it is, in a measure, a reflection of the electorate, through the calibre of the state superintendent.

Let us have competent county superintendents, with the vim to do a man's work. Give the superintendent a competent, professional teacher for an office assistant, and in counties where necessary, provide for assistant superintendents sufficient to meet the public demands. ALTA KING.
