DAIRY SPECIAL WILL BE SENT THROUGH VALLEY

O. A. C. AND SOUTHERN PACIFIC TO INTEREST FARMERS IN DAIRY INDUSTRY.
Under the auspices of the experiment department of the Oregon Agricultural College, and with the cooperation of the Southern Pacific Company, a special dairy demonstration train will be run over the latter's lines through the Willamette Valley and Southern Oregon in February. The object of the special will be to increase the interest in dairying everywhere and to revive it in those localities where it has been slack in the last year or so.

The operation of these trains is a factor of great importance to the dairyman and farmer. The object lesson, the lecturer, the personal interview, the answering of questions—all of these methods are used on the train and each has its part and place in the effort toward improving the producing capacity of Oregon farms.
The agricultural college decided upon the dairy special late in December and was assured of the railroad's support and cooperation by General Freight Agent H. A. Hinshaw and General Passenger Agent J. M. Scott. The company will furnish free the stock cars to accommodate the hogs and cows; a flat car for demonstration purposes; baggage car for exhibits and display; day coach for accommodation of the public at the lectures and Pullman sleepers for the party accompanying the train. The trip will last about ten days.
