In the picture it is built of peau de seiche, with chiffon velvet trimming, and for the early spring the combination is a beautiful one. Poplin combined with moire might be used later or caution crape with satin charmeuse.

The two piece skirt gives the box plait effect at the front and at the back, and the yoke extends over the back and sides. The blouse is made with kimono sleeves that are loose under the arms.

For the medium size the gown will require five and one-half yards of ma-



terial twenty-seven inches wide, one yard twenty-seven inches wide for the trimming. The width of the skirt at the lower edge is one yard and twenty-eight inches.
