BIG SUIT RESULTS OF AUTO ACCIDENT AT CRESWELL

Parents of Little Children Killed by Shasta Limited Sue for \$30,000.

Readers of The Sentinel will remember the deplorable railroad accident which occurred April 25 near Creswell, when the Shasta Limited ran into an automobile and killed the driver and four children, George Robinett, aged 9 years; Beula Morris, aged 13 years; Doris Trennor, aged 6 years, and Vincent Trennor, aged 8 years. The fathers of the children are plaintiffs, and in each case seek \$7500 damages, a total of \$30,000.

The fathers of the children are H. B. Robinett, S. S. Morris and F. W. Trennor. Besides the railway company, Wm. O'Malley, the veteran engineer, and F. B. Howe, the fireman, who had charge of the engine that day, are made defendants.

The death of the children took place as they were riding to Sunday School in an automobile being driven across the S. P. track by Frank Sly, who also received injuries from which he died in less than 24 hours afterward. The complaints state that the private crossing where the accident occurred was one which the railway company had invited the public to use as a right-of-way and crossing and had constructed a gate through the fence for that purpose. It is alleged that the train was traveling at a high and dangerous rate of speed and approached the crossing without warning, or without ringing the bell or blowing the whistle. It is stated in the complaint that Wm. O'Malley and F. B. Howe were in charge of the engine, and that they carelessly and negligently approached the crossing. On either side of the right-of-way, states the complaint, for a distance of a mile and a half, there were no obstructions to the view of the engineer and fireman. It is alleged that had they maintained a lookout they could have prevented the collision. It is further alleged that the death of the children was caused by the carelessness and negligence of the defendants named.

A BIG GRAPEVINE AND FINE FIELD OF CORN

Inspector Stewart Sees Mammoth Grape Vine and Corn That Yields 100 Bushels to Acre on McKenzie

C. E. Stewart, county fruit inspector, found an immense grape vine on the farm of C. O. Einer on the McKenzie river. The vine has four arms extending in that many directions and each one is 80 feet long. The branches are trained on trellises seven feet high and the vine is literally covered with big sweet grapes, says Mr. Stewart. Four years ago, Mr. Einer told him, he gathered 800 pounds of the fruit from the vine. Mr. Einer did not know how long the vine had been growing but it was about as large as it is now when he bought the place a number of years ago.

Mr. Stewart also found on the Einer place a white fig tree, which is only the fourth he has seen in Lane County. There are two crops of this variety of figs, the first one maturing about the middle of September, but the second one seldom matures in this climate.

At the N. N. Kaldor place, between Waltherville and Leaburg, Mr. Stewart found some of the best corn he has ever seen in his life. Mr. Kaldor told him that by actual measurement, taking two bushels of shucked corn to one shelled, he had 100 bushels of shelled corn to the acre, which is an immense yield, even for the well known corn states of the middle west. Mr. Stewart says the McKenzie Valley is the best corn country he has seen in Oregon. The soil seems to grow anything, and the corn grows to perfection. The ground all the way up, as far as it is cultivated, is a sandy loam and is very rich. Some of the best apples he ever saw were also found by the fruit inspector on his trip up the river.

Can't Get Cars Enough
Silverton Appeal: The Silverton Lumber company is finding it difficult at present to get cars enough to handle their increased orders from outside points. The prices on lumber have not varied much for several months past, but the full trade is stimulating orders. The company could use 50 cars right now if it were possible to get them.
