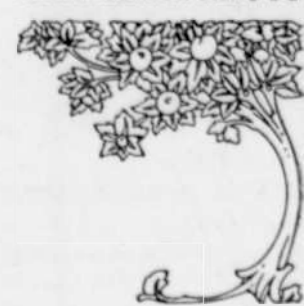

Qualification of Voters at Road Supervisor Election

The county court is in receipt of many letters from people in different road districts, asking about the qualifications of voters at the coming elections to choose road supervisors. There is no law requiring such election, therefore there is no law giving the qualifications of voters, but the commissioners are advising the people that all persons who pay taxes on real property in the several districts are qualified to vote for road supervisor. Qualification of voters in road supervisor elections should not be confused with qualifications for voters in elections to vote a special tax. In the latter case the law is specific and voters must be resident taxpayers.
