Photo Plays

Here and There About Plays and Players

Beautiful Scene of Volcano in Eruption. What is probably the most beautiful and spectacular scene ever seen here in a moving picture will be shown in the eruption of a real volcano in "Neal of the Navy" at the Rex theater tonight. The cameraman that got this scene was on Pathe Weekly staff, but as this scene fitted so well in this picture it was accordingly switched from the Pathe Weekly. All who have seen this volcano scene claim it to be one of the grandest sights they have ever witnessed.

Picture Player Has No "Snap."

Many people have asked how long each day a picture player has to work when making pictures. A great deal depends on circumstances and when taking exterior scenes they use ordinary day light and cannot work much after 3 o'clock in the afternoon, but when

in the studio making interior scenes where they use artificial light a great deal, they are often called upon to work until midnight. The customary hours are, however, from 9 o'clock in the morning until 5 or 6 o'clock in the evening. It is claimed by some actors that the electric lights, which are of a special kind are sort of a blue tint, are injurious to the eyes, but this is not an established fact yet, however.
