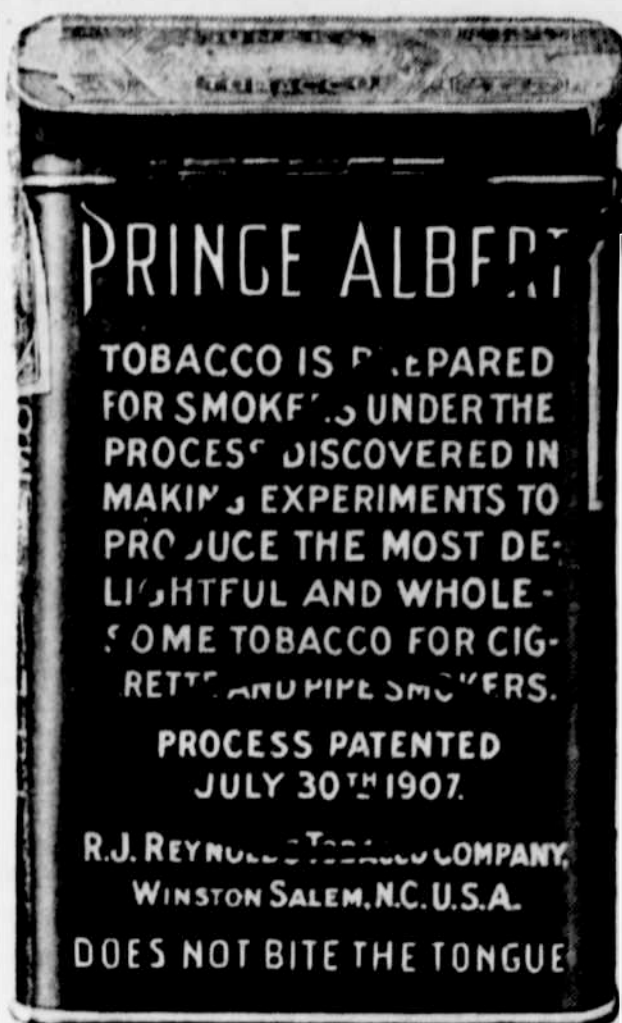

DIVINE LOVE FOR THE NEW CREATION

God's Love For the Church
Different From His Love
For the World.

Adam's Disobedience Alienated His Posterity From God—Jesus' Obedience Secured Opportunity of Return to Divine Favor—Justification and Sanctification—New Creation Tested as to Loyalty and Obedience—The Messiah of Many Members—Riches of Love Divine, All Love Excelling.



PASTOR RUSSELL

Toronto, Ont., July 18. — Pastor Russell spoke here today. We report his discourse from the text, "The Father Himself loveth you." — John 16:27. First the speaker pointed out the difference between God's love for the sinless angels and His love for Adam's sinful posterity. God had a sympathetic love for humanity, not an affectionate love; for there was nothing in fallen man worthy of Divine love. This sympathetic love has in mercy arranged a Plan of Salvation for our race. God has provided the death of our Lord Jesus Christ to be our Redemption-price to recover mankind, not from eternal torture, but from death. Otherwise we would have no future life. — John 3:16.

This step on behalf of humanity turned our dying condition into a sleeping state. Instead of perishing like the brute beasts, men merely fall asleep, to await the morning of the New Dispensation, when our Lord will call the sleepers from the tomb. (John 5:28, 29.) They will come forth to an opportunity for restitution to human perfection in a world-wide Paradise. As St. Peter declared, all the Holy Prophets made repeated references to the time when the willing and obedient shall be brought back into fellowship with God, and all the wicked destroyed as unworthy of favor. — Acts 3:19-23.

God's Love For the Church.

Then the Pastor discussed the Church and showed that God's love for the saints is very different from His love for the fallen race. The Church consists of all those who are in covenant relationship with God through Christ. (Psalm 50:5.) It does not include those who merely turn from sin to say, "I will lead a wicked life no longer." These are still of the world, "children of wrath even as others"; they have not taken the step which will constitute them children of God.

Adam had been a son of God; but he had sinned and forfeited the Father's love. When he came under the sentence, "Dying, thou shalt die," he was cut off from fellowship with God. He and his posterity became sinners under the death sentence, unworthy of Divine favor. While God permitted certain blessings to come to mankind—sunshine, rain, etc.—He has kept aloof from our race, treating them as aliens and strangers. We must be justified, made right, before He will deal with us.

God set aside six great Thousand-Year Days for the world to have experience with sin and death. Even the wisest of mankind have been unable to extricate themselves from the bondage of corruption. God's time for their deliverance is the great Seventh Thousand-Year Day, when Jesus and His Church will bless all the families of the earth. Our race has had a severe experience with sin and its results. As we look over into Europe, we see what evil passions can accomplish. Yet the savagery there is only beginning; it will be very much worse. With all our preaching and teaching we have not bettered our race greatly. When they realize the true situation men will know that sin is the most terrible thing.

The Beginning of the New Creation.

The remainder of the sermon dealt with the development of the Church. According to the Divine Program for man's salvation, our Lord was to die sacrificially for the race, the Church was to be gathered, and then the Millennium was to begin. The Father had planned that the New Creation should be those who would give up their human rights, laying them at His feet, and desiring to know and to do His will. This our Lord Jesus did at Jordan; and God started the New Creation by begetting the Son to the Divine nature, anointing Him with the Holy Spirit to be the great King and Priest for mankind. Then for three and a half years the Father tested Him, and found Him worthy. — Rev. 5:12.

One feature of this Divine Plan was not revealed in the past—there was to be a Body of Christ, consisting of both Jews and Gentiles, made one New Man, one complete Christ, with Christ Jesus as their Head (Ephesians 1:19-23; 2:11-16; 3:4-11; 4:11-16.) The Messiah is to be composed of many members, selected from amongst mankind. The call went first to the Jews, of whom about twenty-five thousand quickly responded, so deeply consecrated were they. Then the door was opened to the Gentiles. But they had not had the assistance of the Law Covenant, and therefore it has taken eighteen hundred years to complete the predestined number. Only those are called who have the disposition of faith and obedience to the Divine will.

TERRIFIC FIGHTING ON BATTLE LINE IN WEST

Germans Repeatedly Attempt
to Recapture Positions
Taken by French.

London.—Violent artillery cannonading in the Champagne, punctuated by sharp infantry attacks and counter attacks, have resulted in alternate gains for both forces, with no vital change in the military situation. All reports indicate terrific fighting along the whole front.

Five successive infantry attacks were delivered by the Germans in the Champagne in an effort to recapture the positions recently taken by the French. The French war office statement says these assaults were repulsed. Near Soissons the Germans penetrated a French trench but subsequently were ejected.

German counter attacks to retrieve their losses northeast of Meunil hill were repulsed. Here, according to Berlin's admission, the French cut through on a front of about 200 yards.

In Belgium, the Germans broke through the British line near Pilkem, but were driven out by bombing parties. North of the Ypres-Commines canal an underground fight occurred in which the British "moles" routed the hostile burrowing party and exploded their charge.

REPORT FROM U. S. PLEASES GERMANS

Berlin, via London.—The Berlin newspapers publish dispatches from the United States announcing that it is understood that the Washington administration will soon issue a warning to Americans not to travel on merchantmen which are armed.

The newspapers say that this announcement comes at a timely moment to confirm the hopes entertained in Germany that the new policy enunciated in the German memorandum which declares that armed merchantmen will be treated by Germany after February 29 as warships would be found to conform to the revised ideas of the American department of state on the conduct of submarine warfare, and hence tend to simplifying in the future the situation between Germany and America on this issue.

DOOR CLOSED TO TEUTONS

Decree issued at Rome Forbids Importation of Austro-Hungarian Goods.

Rome.—The last gap in the allies' economic boycott of the central powers was closed by issuance of an Italian decree forbidding, under heavy penalty, the importation of any Austro-German goods. This step was announced after the French premier Briand had held several hours' conference with the foreign office.

Ordinarily such a step would have provoked an immediate declaration of war, but it is not believed here that Germany cares to enroll Italy among her open enemies, both for financial and military reasons.

Briand said that the allies are determined to throttle the Teutons from an economic standpoint while making them suffer from a military standpoint.

TEMPERANCE DAY IS NAMED

New York Health Board Begins Temperance Crusade.

New York.—The city board of health announced inauguration of a temperance crusade. The board has requested clergymen to deliver temperance sermons Sunday, February 20, which will be called "Temperance Sabbath."

Meanwhile uniformed police officers of the health squad and sanitary inspectors will distribute in saloons and clubs throughout the city pamphlets setting forth the dangers of alcoholic indulgence. Washington's birthday motion picture theaters will display films furnished by the board portraying "the curse of drink and all its attendant evils."

Potato Flour Factory in California.

Stockton, Cal.—With a capacity for grinding 25 tons of potatoes a day, a plant for the manufacture of potato flour was placed in operation at Middle river by the Air Utilities company of New York.

Brazil Fires On German Ship.

Para, Brazil.—The interned German steamer Asuncion made a vain effort to escape, but was shelled, overhauled and brought back by Brazilian cruisers. The captain denied attempting to escape.

Belgium Denies Peace Terms Offered.

London.—The Belgian legation announced that the rumors which have been circulated that peace proposals recently were made by Germany to the Belgian government are devoid of foundation.
