Mr. Parker was 70 years of age. He was a Civil war veteran and was with Sherman in his famous march to the sea. He had been a resident of Lane county since 1868. The funeral was held at Pleasant Hill.

NEW MILITARY BILL IS BEFORE SENATE

Measure is Designed to Give Army a War Strength of 700,000.

Washington.—The new army bill was reported to the senate by Senator Chamberlain, chairman of the senate committee on military affairs. The measure, which is the first of the administration's national defense bills to be introduced, gives the United States a peace strength of about 175,000 men for the regular army, and a war strength of 250,000, which, with the national guard and volunteers, will make a total estimated war strength of about 700,000 men.

Aside from its plan virtually to double the army and national guard, the senate bill has four striking features. One of these authorizes federal volunteer force in peace times, the object sought by Secretary Garrison with his continental army plan. Another mobilizes all whose callings fit them for special war duty. The third federalizes the national guard and the fourth contemplates training officers from among graduates of military schools and colleges.

Army Bill Also Before House.
Chairman Hay, of the military committee, has introduced an army bill in the house.

The house bill proposes to increase the regular army to a strength of 140,000 fighting troops, which means the addition of 40,000 men and 7439 officers. It also provides 786 additional officers for detached service with the national guard, military schools and elsewhere. A maximum strength, however, is fixed at 170,000 men.

The bill provides for federalization of the national guard under a militia pay bill substantially similar to that proposed in the senate bill. The house plans, however, differ with the senate bill in that the president is authorized to draft national guardsmen into the federal service on the outbreak of war. Gore Resolution is Killed in Senate.

By a vote of 68 to 14 the senate carried out President Wilson's wish and killed Senator Gore's resolution to warn Americans off armed belligerent ships.

In a turbulent scene, such as is seldom witnessed in the senate, voting proceeded, with senators shouting objections, futilely demanding recognition to explain their positions and making hot retorts to each other, all of which were out of order.

At one time so many senators were shouting for the vice president's recognition that the sergeant-at-arms was called to restore quiet.

The fourteen senators who voted against killing the Gore resolution were:

Borah, Chamberlain, Clapp, Cummings, Fall, Gallinger, Gronna, Jones, La Follette, McCumber, Norris, O'Gorman, Sherman, Works.

Wilson Asks Republicans.
President Wilson appealed directly to Representative Bennet and Representative Lenroot, republican members of the house rules committee, to consider the armed ship issue without partisan bias and assist in getting a vote on a resolution warning Americans off armed ships. For an hour he discussed the foreign situation with the two republican members and told them of the necessity of demonstrating that reports abroad that the majority of congress was not with him, are erroneous.

After the conference Mr. Lenroot said the republicans had no intention of bringing party considerations into the issue.

IRISH FORM ORGANIZATION

Separation From Britain is Demanded in "Declaration of Independence."

New York.—Resolutions termed "an Irish declaration of independence," appealing for the recognition of Ireland as a nation by the powers of the world and demanding that Americans be warned not to travel on ships carrying contraband, were adopted by the Friends of Irish Freedom, a national organization formed here as the outgrowth of a conference called to define the attitude which it is contended Irishmen in this country should assume toward Great Britain.

Victor Herbert was chosen president in place of Justice John W. Goff, who declined to serve because of his advanced age. The speakers included James Smith, of Lowell, Mass.; Mrs. Ellen Ryan Jolly of Pawtucket, R. I.; Joseph McLaughlin, of Philadelphia, national president of the Ancient Order of Hibernians; Matthew Cummings, of Boston; Hugh O'Neill and Miss Josephine McGarry, of Chicago, and J. P. Mulcahy, of Butte, Mont.

Colonel House is Back From Europe.

New York.—Colonel E. M. House, who sailed for Europe December 28 on a confidential mission for President Wilson, arrived here on the steamship Rotterdam from Falmouth and departed at once for Washington.
