Terrible Situation at Zacatecas.

Very few people realize the conditions that exist in Mexico. If such conditions existed in far-away India, we probably would be aroused to action of some kind. The following is a translation made for The Sentinel from "El Occidental," of Guadalajara, from its issue of November 18, 1916:

A person worthy of being believed who has just returned from Zacatecas,

where he went on a government mission, tells us that the situation there is critical, and that the inhabitants are without even the most indispensable elements for remedying it.

Typhus fever associated with wretchedness and filth.

Lack of water, not only for irrigation but such as prevents the opening of the public baths except once each week, and then the price is beyond the reach of the poor people.

The number of inhabitants has been reduced to one-third or less.

The only people seen on the streets are those who have their hair cropped short, convalescents, or sick.

Among these who thus miserably tramp the streets of this wretched city are numerous groups of people begging.

Almost all of the stores are closed.

The streets have been converted into cesspools.

The mortality can be estimated as follows: Thirty per cent from typhus fever, and 50 per cent from intestinal infection.

Plant Looks Like Christmas Tree.

E. R. Spence found a curious plant at Lorane last week. It has the appearance of a diminutive Christmas tree and bears bell-shaped flowers now in bloom. The plant has sharp spines that warn against handling too roughly.
